celebrated. 3. Cultural Exchange: The Hanfu Society will actively participate in multicultural activities on campus to promote intercultural exchange. We hope to provide international students with opportunities to learn about Chinese culture and traditions, and we strongly welcome them to share their own culture. 4. Community Involvement: The Hanfu Society will be actively involved in the local community, contributing to the multiculturalism of the city of Liverpool and promoting community integration and mutual understanding. Expected purpose of the society: Through the creation of the Hanfu Society, we hope to achieve the following intended purposes: 1. Promote understanding and respect for Chinese culture and traditional Chinese clothing. 2. - d. Providing scrutiny of the University and the Guild, as well as raising awareness and supporting the governance and democratic functions of these organisations;
- e. Providing a platform for students to express and communicate their views, as well as developing and giving opportunities for students to obtain skills in broadcasting, journalism, and publishing;

Providing an excellent standard of content, and recognising and championing outstanding content produced by students.
